## RECIPES

This'is the first of a continuing series of. feature recipes. Shirley has contributed some easy to prepare salad recipes. We hope to feature some of the best recipes from our lunch program ( not including the mustard chicken, or tube steaks!). If anyone else has some favourite recipes, we hove vou'll share them with us.

CARROT AND MILK PUNCH
1 lb. grated carrots
1 pint milk
juice of $1 / 2$ lime
sugar to taste

METHOD

1. Wash, peel and grate carrots
2. Place grated carrots into a piece of muslin and squeeze to extrqct juice.
3. Mix lime juice with carrot juice and add milk and sugar.
4. Chill and serve with lots of rice.

## TOSSED RAW SALAD

1 small cucumber
2 oz. cabbage shredded
1/2 green pepper
1 large onion cut in rings
2 medium-sized carrots, shredded or grated
1 bunch lettuce
1 sprig parsley.
Tossing Mixture
Mix together in a bowl l/2 tsp. mustard, l tsp. salt, l/2 tasp white pepper, 4 tbsp. salad oil, 2 tbsp vinegar or lime juice.

Method
Prepare and wash all vegetables. Wash lettuce leaf by leaf, preferably under running water, and dry them in a tea towel.

Soak cabbage in salted water before shredding. Wash cucumber. Score it with a fork and slice thinly. Toss all the vegetables in the tossing mixture and serve in an attractive salad bowl.

1 small cabbage, head shredded
2 tablespoons chopped green pepper

6 slices fresh pineapple
salt to taste
4 tablespoons grated carrot.
METHOD
Combine green peppers and shredded cabbages in a salad bowl. Mix salt, sugar and vinegar until the sugar is dissolved. Pour over cabbage mixture. Sprinkle with carrot and top with pineapple.

THREE FRUIT PUNCH

2 oz . diced pineapple
2 glace cherries

1 cup orange juice
1/2 cup lemonade
l cup pineapple juice

METHOD
Put the pineapple and cherries in a bowl. Mix pineapple juice, orange juice and lemonaide together. Serve with ice cubes
